- Train coaches by teaching them how to run an age appropriate practice, the importance of having a theme and how all aspects of your practice incorporate your theme, showing them the correction methodology of freeze/recreate/rehearse/replay and emphasizing the importance of a team meeting to make sure parents and coaches share the same developmental mission.

Coaching Philosophy

- Strong individual skills equal strong team skills.
- Develop individual skills through technique and small-sided games (1 v 1, 2 v 2, 4 v 3 etc.)
- Develop field skills specific to their position (goalies, backs, midfielders and forwards)
- All practices have a theme. Each practice is divided into a warm up, games that support the main coaching point, games with goals, and then a scrimmage followed by a cool down. The theme is reinforced through all phases of the practice and taught through repetition.
- Practices are fast paced with an emphasis on as many touches on the ball as possible. Practices are carefully planned to minimize transition time (moving from one space to another, having practice vests/cones/balls ready to go, etc).
- The ultimate challenge for any coach is to take a group of unknown players with huge ability differences, and create a "team". To accomplish that, a coach must provide an environment that is safe, positive, and structured.
